that W. B. Anderson, of the State and County
aforeaid, in consideration of the sum of three
hundred dollars, to be paid to me as follows
by Willis Durham, of the State and County aforesaid
viz: One thousand dollars cash (\$1,000), the receipt
of which is hereby acknowledged, and the sum of
four hundred thirty three dollars and thirty
three and one third cents each (\$433 $\frac{1}{3}$) of this date,
with interest at 7 per cent per annum, payable
annually or to be added to the principal when
granted, bargained, sold, and released, and by
these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release
unto the said Willis Durham, all that tract or parcel
of land, known as a part of the Hiram Bennett tract
containing ten hundred acres, more or less, (one
half acre around the grave yard excepted) situated
in the State and County aforesaid, beginning with a
stone in the fork of the Bear Branch, and running
