L. Wood, of Spartanburg County, in the State aforesaid, we have granted, bargained, sold, aliened, released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said W. L. Wood, all our right, title and interest in the Wood's Machine place, together with all the appendances belonging to said machine place, including all our water power, with the full right of Reid, granted to elevate the water power in the dam sufficient for the purposes of operating this machinery of every description for any purpose. This grant to include as above, the lands upon which the machinery is now located (all the machinery now upon said location excepted) and all our rights definite or implied by our papers, and from us the conveying of our right of elevating the water includes the land in the Dam; also a certain lot or parcel of land situate in the State and County above named on

Machine creek, at the old Reid, machine place, beginning and running as follows: On the "Eg. Reid Spring" above the machine, on the North side of the creek N by E 6.50 to stone in W. L. Wood's line, thence S 1/4 W with W. L. Wood line to the creek, thence up the creek to the Spring, containing one acre, the same more or less, and all right and privilege to elevate the water in this dam at pleasure. Together with all and singular the rights, members, necessaries and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining.
