Know all men by these presents that I, Wm. W. Gaffney, of Gaffney City, of Spartanburg in the State aforesaid in consideration of the sum of One Hundred Dollars to me paid by Robt. F. Spencer, of the same place, in this State aforesaid, have granted, bargained, sold and released and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Robert Spencer, a certain lot of land lying in Gaffney City, S. C., and adjoining Mrs. Ann Mills' lot, Beginning at said Mrs. Mills' corner, in Leonard Street, S. 57 $\frac{1}{4}$  E. with the line to her corner, one hundred and eighty feet; thence N. 34 $\frac{1}{4}$  W. sixty-six feet to state; thence E. 57 $\frac{1}{4}$  W. one hundred and Eighty feet to state; thence N. 34 $\frac{1}{4}$  E. Sixty-six feet to beginning, containing eleven thousand and eight hundred and Eighty (11880) square feet, bounded by Mrs. Mills' lot to the N. E. and my own land and Leonard Street on the other sides. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the premises belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining. Know all men by these presents, that I, Lee Linder, of the County of Spartanburg, in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of Twenty-five Hundred (\$2500) Dollars to me paid by J. R. Littlejohn, of the County of Spartanburg, in the State aforesaid, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said J. R. Littlejohn, all that certain piece, parcel, or tract of land lying, being and situated in both the Counties of Spartanburg and Union, of the State aforesaid, and known as the "Lee Griffin" tract of land, and bounded on the north by lands of J. E. Burgess, on the east by the old "Bullock Place," lately known as the "Horst Place," and on the west by James Wood, J. C. Green and J. R. Littlejohn, the part of which said tract, lying in Union County, was bought on Saturday in January, 1869, and Sheriff's deed made the 5<sup>th</sup> day of January, 1869, by J. Rice Rogers, Sheriff, and the part of said tract lying in Spartanburg County was bought in Spartanburg on Saturday in March, 1869, and Sheriff's deed taken 6<sup>th</sup> of March, 1869, said tract of land, according to recent plat made by J. S. Sloane, Surveyor, containing Three Hundred and Sixty-two and one-half (362 1/2) acres, more or less.

The rent of said tract of land accruing from J. E. Burgess' lease for the year 1884, is hereby reserved to the said Lee Linder.
