Know all men by these presents,
that I, Jane Harrison in the State aforesaid,
for and in consideration of the love & affection I
have for my children E. J. Harrison, M. Harrison,
Jane Sumner, Mary Walker, M. S. Harrison,
Christian Strange, Massie Torgue and A. A. Harrison,
and to secure to them the rents & profits of the
following described premises, and in consid-
eration of the sum of five dollars to me
paid by S. D. McBrady of the County of Spartan-
burg in the State aforesaid, have granted,
bargained, sold, and released and by these
presents do grant, bargain, sell and release
unto the said S. D. McBrady, all that Lot or parcel
of land lying and being in the County
of Spartanburg and State aforesaid and
bounded on the North by Alex Pruitt and
on the West by Nancy Leacock and on the
South and East by A. A. Harrison and E. L.
Lindred and containing twenty one acres
more or less. for more particular description
see plat made by H. C. Leacock Esq. in
partition suit - I do trust nevertheless; and
it is the true intent and meaning of these
presents that the said S. D. McBrady shall
hold the said premises for the term of twenty
years from and after the date of my death.
for the sole use & behoof of my said children,
or those of them who may be alive at
that time, or their children per stirpes

And the said S. J. McLeary shall have the power & he is hereby authorized to meet the said promisors, to collect the moneys, & after paying expenses, to divide the balance among my said children or their guardians equally per stirpes. And after the expiration of Twenty years from my death as aforesaid, the said S. J. McLeary shall have the power, and is hereby authorized to sell the said promisors at public or private sale, on such terms as he may think best for my said children, and to divide the proceeds of such sale among said children equally per stirpes; and to make good & sufficient titles to the purchasers or purchasers of said promisors. Together with all and singular the rights, moneys, covenants, and appurtenances to the said promisors belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the promisors before mentioned unto the said S. J. McLeary as trustee as aforesaid. And I do hereby bind myself & my heirs, executors, and administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said promisors unto the said S. J. McLeary trustee as aforesaid, against me and my heirs, lawfully claiming, or to claim the same, or any part thereof. County in the State aforesaid, have granted,
bargained, sold, and released, and by
these presents do grant, bargain, sell and
release unto the said P. F. Williams all our
interest, right, title and claim in and to
a certain tract of land lying and being
