Carrier all the following lots of land lying in the incorporate limits of the City of Spartanburg, in said State lying South

of Henry Street, and East of Granite Street, being a portion of the lands formerly owned by said Melrose Graves, and is hereby set forth in a plat of said lands made by W. T.
