Know all men by these presents that I, William L. Lanford, of the County of Spartanburg, in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of One Thousand and Eight Hundred Dollars to me paid by A. B. Prince and J. C. C. Prince, (J. C. C. Prince lives in Polk County, S. C.) of the County of Spartanburg, in the State aforesaid, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said A. B. Prince and J. C. C. Prince two parcels of land, described as follows: One piece whereon I now live, and described by plat made by Nathl. W. Thompson Oct. 21st, 1875, as Lot No 1, it being a part of the land I bought of Simpson Quinch. Beginning at a Rock Corner on Blackstock road, and running S. 81 $\frac{1}{4}$ W., 23.65 to a rock corner; thence S. 13 $\frac{1}{2}$ W., to branch; thence with the said branch to the head; thence S. 67 E., 17.31 to stone on H. E. Haynie's line, it being the corner of lots No. 1 and 2; thence N. 42 $\frac{1}{2}$ E., with Haynie's line to the Blackstock road, thence with the said road to the beginning corner, containing (95) Ninety-five acres, more or less. The other piece or parcel contains five acres, more or less, it being a piece I purchased of John M. Bowen, and described as follows: bounded by lands of John M. Bowen, D. M. Bryce and Wm. L. Lanford, commencing on Rock Corner, on D. M. Bryce's line, thence with Bryce's line to a rock corner, formerly a pine corner, J. M. Bowen and D. M. Bryce's corner, on W. L. Lanford's line; thence with W. L. Lanford's line to J. M. Bowen's and W. L. Lanford's corner; thence with said Bowen & Lanford's line 23 Poles to rock corner, thence 34 poles to the beginning rock corner.
