of the sum of eight hundred dollars, to me in hand
paid, at and before the reciting of these presents by
Aaron H. Morgan, of Spartanburg County, in the State
aforesaid, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged)
here granted, bargained, sold and released, and
by these presents do grant & bargain, sell and release
unto the said A. H. Morgan, all that tract or parcel
of land, situated no^t S. of the river, Spartanburg County,
known as the McLean place, containing one hundred
and seventy acres, more or less, bounded
by lands of Nancy Allen, Jas. L. Clegg, Sam. Turner,
Alexander Prevott, and others. Together with all
and singular the rights, reservations, limitations
and appurtenances to the said premises belonging,
or in anywise incident or appertaining: To have
and to hold, all and singular the said premises
before mentioned unto the said Aaron H. Morgan
his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind
myself, my heirs executors and administrators
to warrant and forever defend all and singular
the said premises unto the said Aaron H. Morgan,
his heirs and assigns, against myself, and my

eight hundred and seventy one, and in the
Ninety five year of the sovereignty and independence

 We the above named by these presents,
 that we, G. R. West, R. G. West, S. E.
 West, C. J. West, E. D. Layton, J. S. West
 & S. West, heirs at law and devisees of
 David West, deceased of Spartanburg County, in the
 State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Three
 hundred dollars, and for the further considerations
 herein after expressed, to us paid by M. C. Morrow
 and C. Morrow, of Spartanburg County in this
 aforesaid, we do grant, bargain, sell and
 release unto the said M. C. Morrow & C. Morrow
 all that tract or parcel of land, or our inhabitants,
 the same being eight hundred acres, situated
 and being in the State and County aforesaid,
 in Glendale Springs Precinct, containing one
 thousand and eleven acres more or less, bounded
 by land of R. G. West, F. J. West, J. C. George,
 and others, and known as the David West plantation.
 Now the further consideration is this, that the said
 M. C. Morrow and C. Morrow, are to receive of either
 S. E. West, C. J. West and W. S. West, to live with them
 as part of their family, to furnish them with necessary
 bedding, clothing and board in a manner suited to
 their station in life, so long as they see fit to live
 with them or remain on the place, and in case there
 should be any difficulty arise as to whether the said
