aforesaid, (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged)
have granted, bargained, sold and released, and
by these presents do give & bargain, sell and release
unto the said A. H. Morgan, all that tract or parcel
of land, situated on Sager river, Spartanburg County,
known as the McKinn Place, containing one hundred
and twenty six (126) acres, more or less, bounded
by lands of Nancy Allen, Jas L. Linn, Sam Linn, Sam,
Alexander Pruitt, and others. Together with all
and singular the rights, revenues, hereditaments
and appurtenances to the said premises belonging,
or in anywise incident or appertaining: To have
and to hold, all and singular the said premises
before mentioned unto the said Aaron H. Morgan
his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind
myself, my heirs, executors and administrators
to warrant and forever defend all and singular
the said premises unto the said Aaron H. Morgan,
his heirs and assigns, against myself, and my

eight hundred and seventy one, and in the
Nineteenth year of the Sovereignty and Independence
