Whereas by the provisions of  
Section 17, Chapter XIII, title 3, General Statutes of  
the said State, the County Auditor of each County  
in the said State, is authorized and required annually  
to cause a list of delinquent lands in his County  
to be published weekly for two weeks in one news-  
paper in his County, and to which list there shall  
be attached a notice in the following form, to wit:  
Notice is hereby given that the whole of the several  
wards, lots and parts of lots of real estate described  
in the preceding list or so much thereof as may be  
necessary to pay the taxes, penalties and assessment  
charged thereon, will be sold by the Treasurer of  
Spartanburg County, South Carolina, at his  
office in said County, on May 9<sup>th</sup>, A.D. 1873,  
unless said taxes, assessments and penalties be  
paid before that time, and said sale will be  
continued, from day to day, until all of said  
wards, lots and parts of lots of real estate shall  
be sold or offered; and whereas there appears  
on the Tax Duplicate of Spartanburg County,  
for 1872, 150 acres of land, valued at \$1000  
unpaid in the name of William Dyer, the tax,  
cost and penalties on the same being twenty  
six & 69/100 dollars. And whereas the above Wm Dyer  
neglected to pay to J. P. D. Camp, Treasurer of the County

aforesaid sale so held by J. P. D. Camp, Treasurer  
of Spartanburg County, on May Ninth, 1873,  
one D. C. Cross & Co. promised to and did  
pay to said J. P. D. Camp, County Treasurer, the  
sum of twenty six & 69/100 \$26.69 dollars (being the  
tax cost and penalties on the above described

property, and conveyed in the name of said William J. for  
 the best quantity of it by any person then and there present  
 viz: One hundred and fifty acres and, to whom a Deed  
 'grant Land Certificate' was issued specifying the above  
 facts: And whereas, in accordance with an act of the  
 General Assembly, entitled 'An act to amend an act  
 entitled 'An act providing for the Assessment and  
 Acquisition of Property' passed September 16, 1866, and an  
 act amendatory thereof, approved March 12, 1872, it is  
 the duty of the County Auditor, to make and deliver to  
 any purchaser New Title or assigns a deed of conveyance  
 for real estate so sold, and not redeemed, in accordance  
 with law by the party, or whomsoever it was  
 conveyed or any other person interested therein, within  
 Ninety days from date of said sale, on payment of the legal

 lot, tract or parcel of land, bounded and described as  
 follows, to wit: Bounded by the lands of Gene Cassin's  
 et of H. H. Thomson of Henry Kisseloh and to J. R. Corum  
 and hath the following marked and distances, to wit:  
 Commencing at Cassin's and Corum's Hickory corner  
 thence a straight line 6 feet Cassin's line) at 45° 20'  
 47' 90" to stake (H. H. Thomson's) corner, thence straight line  
 N 45° 55' to the cherry (Thomson's Kisseloh corner, thence  
 a straight line (the dividing line between lots 45 & 46)  
 N 55° 14' 90" to a Pine, thence N 59° 17' 90" to a Common  
 Fork corner (Mr J. W. Thomson & J. R. Corum's corner),
