that we A. J. Moore & W. C. Moore,
of the Town of Welford, and of

the County of Spartanburg, in the State aforesaid, for
and in consideration of having erected a Baptist
Church Building in the Town of Welford, known as
the Welford Baptist Church, as well as for the further
consideration of the sum of Three dollars, to us paid
by J. B. Williamson, Robert Wingo and G. H. Mabry,
Trustees elect for said of the County of Spartanburg
in the State aforesaid, have granted, bargained,
sold and released and by these presents do grant,
bargain, sell and release unto the said J. B.
Williamson, Robert Wingo and G. H. Mabry,
Trustees elect for said, and their successors in office
in trust for the use and benefit of said Welford
Baptist Church, all that certain portion, parcel or
lot of land, situated, lying and being in the
aforesaid State and County, in the Town of Welford,
on the South side of the A. C. Airline Railroad
adjoining land on the West of Robert Wingo,
beginning at a stake on said Robert Wingo's line
one hundred feet from said Railroad running
thence S $7\frac{1}{2}$ W 10 with Wingo's line 3.02 to a stake,
thence N $8\frac{1}{2}$ E 3.32 to a stake, thence N $7\frac{1}{2}$ W 3.02
to a stake, thence S $8\frac{1}{2}$ W 3.32 to the beginning stake,
containing Two Four and a half acres, exclusive
to a street twenty feet broad, lying on the West
side of said lot, all of which is more fully shown
by a plat of said lot made by J. B. Williamson,
Georgian August 20, 1863. Together with all singular
rights, members, hereditaments & appurtenances
to the said premises belonging or in anywise
incident or appertaining. To Have and to Hold,
and singular the premises before mentioned
unto the said J. B. Williamson, Robert Wingo and
G. H. Mabry, Trustees, in trust for the use & benefit
of said Welford Baptist Church, and their
successors in office forever. And we do hereby bind
ourselves, and our heirs, executors, administrators
to warrant and forever defend all & singular
the said premises unto the said J. B. Williamson,
Robert Wingo and G. H. Mabry, Trustees aforesaid
and their successors in office and assigns, against
all and singular persons or persons or persons.
