Know all men by these presents that I, Alfred Parris, in
consideration of the sum of Five Dollars to me paid by
Didami Parris, of the County of Spartanburg, in the State
aforesaid, and in consideration of the fact that the money
paid to Martin and Jane Dunn in 1859 for the tract of
land hereinafter mentioned and described, was money
belonging solely and entirely to the said Didami Parris,
being derived from his father's estate, and whereas the
said money never came into my possession, and whereas
the said Didami Parris has been in sole and undisputed
possession and control of said land, claiming it as his
own in full simple for fourteen years, and whereas during
the year A.D. 1879, being desirous of removing every
cloud that might be upon the title of said Didami Par-
ris to said land, and in order to convey to said, Di-
damie Parris that which of right belonged to her, I sign,

and executed to said Didami Parris a deed to said land, but omitted, through inadvertence, to affix a seal to my name, and desiring to perfect said Deed, I the said Alfred Parris, of the County of Union, in the State aforesaid, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, and sell and release unto the said Didami Parris, all that certain piece, parcel, or tract of land, situate, lying and being in the County of Spartanburg, and State aforesaid, on waters of Gilchrist creek containing One Hundred and Forty-five acres more or less, bounded by lands belonging to the estates of Sarah Jennings, deceased, Daniel Anthony, Mrs. Fannie Conn and others. Said tract or parcel of land being the same conveyed to me by Martin and Jane Quinn on the day of January, A.D., 1859, and recorded in the Office of the Register of Deeds Conveyance for Spartanburg County, then District in Book "G." page 38. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or appertaining.

To have all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Didami Parris, her heirs and assigns forever.

And I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, Executrix and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Didami Parris, her heirs and assigns, against me and my heirs, or any other lawfully claiming, or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
