That I, James Petty of Spartanburg County, in aforesaid State, for and in consideration of one thousand dollars, to me paid by Abner Waters of said State and County, have granted, bargained, sold, aliened, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Abner Waters, all that tract or parcel of land, containing two hundred and fifty nine acres, the same, more or less, situated in Spartanburg County, of both sides of Muddy Branch, and bounded on the South by Bearcreek creek, waters of Broad river, bounded by lands of Hugh Moore, Saml. Ross, and others, beginning at the Spring, and running thence N 15 W 44.00 chains to a stake, thence N 89 W 27.44 chs to an Ash, on the banks of Muddy Branch, thence down said branch to forked Poplar, thence N 87 W 21.00 chains to a stake, thence S 22 E 12.50 to a stake, thence South 45.00 chains to the mouth of Muddy Branch, then down said creek, it being the line to a Birch, thence North chains to a Birch on the branch, thence up said branch to the beginning.
