Whereas all men by their presents, that is, Amos Shands, Spartanburg County, in the State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of Six hundred and fifty seven \$400 dollars, to said grantees by Newton & Thomas Nesbitt, of the County of Spartanburg, in the State aforesaid, I, Amos Shands, have granted, bargained, sold and released unto the said Newton & Thomas Nesbitt, a certain portion of my plantation, known as the Rich Hill plantation containing One hundred and thirty one, and a half (131½) acres, more or less. Said tract of land beginning at a stone on Nancy Thomas line, thence S 62½° E 108.50 to a stone, thence S 11 10 5.50 to a stone, thence S 10 ¼° E 6.65 to a stake, centre of Tupper river, thence down the meanderings of said river to a Black Gum, below the mouth of the river, thence N 35 E 45.40, stake, thence a straight line to the beginning corner. The above tract more fully described by Platte on opposite side. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining: To have and to hold all and singular the premises here mentioned unto the said Newton & Thomas Nesbitt, their heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors and administrators, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Newton & Thomas Nesbitt, their heirs assigns, against me and my heirs or any person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
