 of the county of Spartanburg in the state of South Carolina,
 for and in consideration of the sum of One
 Thousand Dollars, to me paid by George
 W. D. Alexander and Wilson S. Sweet of
 Cleveland Ohio have granted, bargained,
 sold, and released, and by these presents
 do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the
 said George W. D. Alexander and Wilson S.
 Sweet, all that tract or parcel of land lying
 and being in the county of Spartanburg in
 the state of South Carolina situated on the head waters
 of Pacolet River with the following metes and
 bounds to wit: Commencing at a Chestnut Flinty
 corner and running or 83.17 18.00 to Pine Knot
 on or near the Greenville county line; thence
 S 43.50 chains to Pine Knot on my own line; thence
 N 79 1/2 E. 34.30 to Pine Knot thence or 23 1/2 N 34.20
 to beginning corner bounded on east by
 Flint Mills on the north by Lipscomb on the west
 by Lipscomb - Barton and Smith, on South by my
 own land - containing One Hundred and
 7/10 acres more or less - Together with all and
