my will and desire that my grand Son James Edwin West do have
my sorrell Horse sam further it is my will and desire that
my Blacksmith Tools do remain on the plantation as the
property of William West but for Ausbourn West & James Edwin West
to have the liberty to use them, but in case of Wm. West's
removable he is to do the best with the same. also it is my
will that Polly West my daughter is to have my interest in
the roade waggon which is one half and the all of the rest
of my property to remain as the property of my beloved
Polly West durina her life & what ever remaining part
the property at her death is to be equally divided between
daughter Polly West & William West / further I do hereby
nominate constitute and appoint Wm West my son & James West
soninlaw my Executors to this my last will & Testamente.
