demands any ways to me belonging during her natural life or
widowhood and after her marriage or decease, all that remains of
my estate to be equally divided among my nine children namely
Cassy, Betty, Perry, David, Mary, Lily, William, Henry
to them and their heirs for ever—I also leave my well beloved
wife Dorcas West Soul exec tri of this my last will and Testa-
ment revoking all other and disavowing all other—will, or
will made by me heretofore either in writing or otherwise,
Then I do I have set my hand and it is thirty first day of August
One Thousand eight hundred and twenty nine in twenty nine Year of
the Independence of the United States of America—
