paid when my too sons Comes of age in Property and my Goods and
Chattles to be Equally devised --- betwixt my wife and too sons
excepting my son William D. Underwood is to have too Cows more
then the rest and lastly I appoint my wife and James Young esq
Executors to this my Last will a Testament Hereby Revoking all
and every, form --- declaring what is Containg in this my Last Will
an Legal testament in witness where of I Have hereunto set my hand
and Seal this the 11 Day, of February 1612
