

In the name of god amen I William Underwood of the District of Spartanburg State of South Carolina planter being in a low state of health but soon in memory thanks to almighty god and calling to mind the shortness of this life of man I have thought proper to make this my last will and testament in the manner and form following that is to say my sole I give unto of god that give it to me and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors after named and as to my worldly goods if faith pleased almighty God of his infinite goodness to endow me with I dispose of them as followeth I term it my will and desire it for all my hasted to be devised ---I bequeath unto my wife Keyiah my Negro boy named Jan while she remains single and if she marries to be divided betwixt the two boys William Underwood and I bequeath unto my two sons William D. and John Underwood my two tracts of land to be equally devised between the two and my wife to have her living on the land her life time and I bequeath unto my daughter Agnes twenty dollars to be paid when my two sons comes of age in property and my Goods and Chattels to be equally devised --between my wife and two sons excepting my son William D. Underwood is to have two cows more than the rest and lastly I appoint my wife and James Young esq Executors to this my last will a Testament hereby revoking all and every former declaration what is contained in this my last will and legal testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 11 day of February 1812
