ed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last
will and testament; that is to say, principally and first of
all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of almighty
God that gave it & my body I Recommend to the earth, to be
buried in decent Christian burial, at the discretion of my ex-
ecutors, nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection, I
shall receive the same again by the right power of God, and
as touching such worldly estate where with it has pleased God
to bless me in this life, I give, devise & dispose of the
same in the following manner & form.

First That all my just Debts be paid, Secondly I give Be-
queath to my Grand Son Hollon Leatherwood one tract of Land
containing seventy five acres more or less situated in Spar-
tanburg District on two Branches waters of James creek it be-
ing a tract of Land I purchased of John Woodruff Deed bearing
Date 28th Day of June 1814 also give to my grand Daughter Hol-
ly Hobley one young Bay mare known by the name of Breezy also
fifty Dollars in Cash/ also give to my Daughter Peggye Leather-
wood During Life one negro Woman named Milley about twenty
five years old, Further wish that ginney Sangford do take the
said Peggye Leatherwood & said negro woman Milley & take care
of his During Life & at her Death that my Executors take the
said negro woman Milley & her of spring if any & sell them &
pay said ginney Sangford full satisfaction for her trouble out
of the sale of said negro's & if any Balance to be Equally Di-
vided between my Children, The Remaining part of my Estate to
Real & Personal I wish to be sold at a credit of twelve
months, ninety pound fourteen shillings Virginia money & to be
Equally Divided between Elizabeth Hobley William Leatherwood
Deceased his Heirs to Recive his part, Nancy Colbert, Frances

Edwards Parney Johnston, Sidney Langford, John Leatherwood &

I equally divided among all my Children say Elizabeth
William Leatherwood Deceased his Heirs to Claim his part
Nancy Caldwel John Leatherwood Frances Edward Penney Johnston
Siddey Langford Thomas Leatherwood James Leatherwood George
Leatherwood Ginny Langford Pilley Langford Butch Langford
& Peggy Leatherwood. Peggers part to remain in the hand of
my Executors to be bonded for her Support at there Discre-

revoke & Disannul all & every other will & testament confirm-
ing this & no other to be my last will & testament in witness
