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WILL OF

ALEXANDER CAMPBELL

In The Name of God Amen I Alexander Campbell of Saint Marks Parish
 Planter being sick and weak in body, but in perfect mind and memory
 thanks be given to God, calling to mind the mortality of my body
 and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die. I do make
 and Ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say principally
 and first of all I give and recommend my soul in the hands of Aligh-
 ty God that gave it. and my body I recommend to the earth to be
 buried in a decent Christian burial at the Discretion of my execu-
 tors hereafter appointed nothing doubting but at the general resur-
 rection I shall receive the same gain by the mighty power of God
 and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it hath pleased God
 to bless me with in this life I give devise and dispose of the same
 in the following manner and for as follows viz:

Imprimis. I lend unto my Loving Sister Mary Hunt during her widow-
 hood all my estate real and personal but in case she should marry
 my will and desire that all my estate both real and personal to be
 in the hands of my executors untill my two Daughters Elizabeth and
 Sarah that arrives to the age of eighteen years, when to be equally
 divided between my said two Daughters Elizabeth and Sarah Hunt of my
 executors hereafter appointed. or by any three men that they shall
 divide the said estate and I do hereby constitute and ordain
 Matthew Singleton & John Singleton Executors of this my last will
 and Testament and making null and void all every other former testa-
 ments bills legacies bequests and Executors by me made in any will
 before named willed bequeathed ratified and confirmed it is and so
 after to be my last will and Testament it is witnessed wherewith I shall
 hereunto set my hand and seal this Nineteenth Day of October 1783
