of Clarendon District and State aforesaid, condidering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound mind and memory do make & publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following (that is to say): First I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Mary Colclough all the property which she possessed or was intitled to, at the time for my Inter marriage with her or which may hereafter have discended or may hereafter descend to me in her right; Also, one Horse which she may choose & a riding chair, six Cows & claves, twenty Head of Hogs which she may choose, One Bed a half of a dozen chairs to her & her Heirs for with its Furniture ever. Also one Negro wench named Lydia which it is my Will that she Reep in in her pofsefsion during her widowhood; It is also my Will that my said Wife do live as long as she remains a Widow on the Plantation on which I now reside in Case my Executors do not sell it, But if it they shall sell it then upon any other of my lands which she may choose. It is also my Will and I wish it distenctly understood that the provision which I have here made for her is to k be in Lieu and Bar of de her right to dower. It is further my will that in case I should hereafter have a child by my said Wife that at the age of twenter one years, it shall have a Tract of Land and twenty Negroes of the same Value with the Land and Negroes which I have given by deed of Gift to each of my sons. Also. I give and bequeath to my youngest son John Ashby Colclough a three Negroes which He may choose in place of old Binah smart & Bella Negroes which I have conveyed to him by deed of Gift & it is further my will that if any any of the others Negroes which I have conveyed to him by the said deed of Gift should die before He shall attain the age of twenty one years that they may be replaced by others such as he may choose. Also I give and bequeath to my said son John Ashby Colclough the following Negroes (that is to say)

Jacob a Boy, Sylva and her children Further I give and bequeath to

Cuffee, his wife Jane and their children: Aiso William a Carpenter

have another Child my it is my will that my said Stock be equally divided between such other child and my said son John-Further I give and bequeath to my said son John Ashby Colclough a dozen silver table spoons and a dozen tea spoons, three Beds and their Furniture and Half of my other Household Furniture the other half of my said Furniture I give to such Child as I may hereafter have and in case I should not have another Child I give and bequeath the said half of my Furniture to my son William A Colclough further give to my said son John Ashby Colclough a small mulatto Boy named Andrew. Lastly it is my will thatall my other Property be equally divided between my two sons William A Colclough and John Ashby Colclough & such other Child as I may hereafter have in case I should have another child Between them and their Heirs forever, provided that if any or either of my said children should die withour ifsue or should their children die without Ifsue then It is my will that such postion or postions which I have hereby given to such child or children shall revert to my other children or to my right Heirs It is further my Las Will that my Executors shall sell any or all of my Lands at their discretion ----And I do hereby constitute and appoint my somewithian A Colclough and John A Colclough together with Christopher McConico Robert brailsford Matthew James and Samuel E Nelson & Colonel Evan Benbow Executors of this my fast Will & Testament, hereby revoking all other wills by me made. And it is my will that my son John A Colclough shall act as my Executor at the age of nineteen years- In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal, this fifth day of July in the year of our Lord One thousand eight Hundred and sixteen & in the forty first year of American Independence Signed sealed and delivered declared by the abovenamed Alexander COLClough to be his last Will & testament in the presence of us who have hereunto subscribed our names as witnefses in the presences of
