ALEXANDER ROBINSON

South Carolina Clarendon County

In the Name of God Amen, I Alexander Robinson of the County and State aforesay Being Weak in body but of Sound Mind, and Memory (by seed be God) do this First Day of January 1798, Make, and Publish, this My Last Will, and Testament In Manner Following (that is to Say) Imprimis, I Give to my Daughter Ann Courtney two Negroes. a boy Named Bobb, and a Girl Named Cloe With there increase Item) I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Mary Adkins, and the heirs of her Body Lawfully begotten, two Negroe Girls, Named Peggy, and Sarah, to be Delivered To her by my Executors. When Ever she Demands them, after the Death of Marmaduke Adkins, her Present Husband, and If She Dies without Leaving, living Issue, then the Said two Negroes, with there Increase, to be Sold, and the Money, arising therefrom To be Equally Divided, amongst my Children, then Living, or there Lawfull Issue) Item I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Robinson, and the heirs of her body Lawfully begotten three Negroes, a wench, Named Tiana, a Girl, Named Dolly, & boy Named James with there Increase and one Feather bed and Furniture to be Delivered to her on the Day of her marriage or being of Lawfull age (Item I Give and Bequeath to My Loving wife Elizabeth Robinson the plantation and Tract of land Where I now Live Containing three hundred acres, with all my house hold Kitchun Furniture, one Negro man Named Flander, and all my stock of Cattell Horses hogs & Sheep, During her Natural Life, and at her Decease the whole to go to my Daughter Elizabeth Robinson, and her Issue, and if she Dies without leaving living Issue, that and the other Property aliready Left her Shall go
