Fourthly, to my brothers Robert Silliman and John Silliman I devise and bequeath my house and lot in Stateburg to be equally divided between them, but my Executors are to sell it for not lefs the 2500- and are to apply such of the rents as they think proper to repair and improve, untill that price can be pbtained, And I authorize either of my Executors with the approbation xm of two others to sell the said premises for that price,and until then to rent ar lease them, and to repair and finish and improve by building a chimmey and fences as they shall think fit-Figthly I give to my brother Samuel Silliman my library and wardrobe together with all my loose papers subject to the / septions herein after made, I also give him my watch now in Charleston for repairmy leather trunk, and on my mothers death one half the dividend on the fund I have Dequeathed to her use, or of the fund itself, and constitute him an Executor; the other half of that dividend or fund I give to James Silliman.
