I do first give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Mary Cantey one negro man paris one small stock of Cattle which remains in her former one small stock of hogs in my own marke one Brown felley by name of peticoats-also one third of the present Crop of provisions one tract of land containing two hundred and Sixty two acres being the tract I now live on--I give unto Thomas Baggs Five shillings-----

I give and bequeath unto his three Daughters Namely Merial Americ Mary Elizabeth and Elvira Baggs- one negro boy name Moses-which is to remain with said Baggs untill his youngest Daughter

Elvira Baggs arrive at the age of foureteen years then the negro Moses is to be sold and the mony arriving from said sold is to be Equally divided between the above named three Daughters ----

Item I now give and bequeath unto my son Gerge Cantey and My son Charles Cantey-all the residue remainder of my property be it reale or persinal wheare ever it may be found to be Equalley Divided between the said Gerge and Charles Cantey- I do further

make and Declare Acknowledge and have appointed my son Gerge Cantey and my son Charles Cantey to be my sole Executors of this my last will and Testament made and signed this Twenty first day of November one thousand Eight hundred and Eight-----
