

K. Huger Executors of this my will & testament.

I leave to my brother in law Wm Simmons, during the lifetime of my wife, & in trust for her use, the yearly Sum of one thousand dollars; to be encreased if any encrease should become necessary, & to be a continued lieu on my estate, in preference to all others

I leave to my brother F. Minlock, during his life, the use of my house & place called Acton, together with the use of all such plate, linnen, & furniture, as may be there, at the time of my death.

To my friend B. Huger, I leave my watch.

To my nephew K. Huger, I leave certain matters of account, known only to himself & to his brother

The rest & residue of my estate, real, & personal, I leave to be equally divided among my children, upon the following conditions-

That they bring into hotchpot, whatever they may have received of me. That my sons, if they choose it, may have the whole of the tideland plantations, upon Securing to my Son in law, the full value of his proportion of the same.

That my sons, if they choose it, may have, as apart of their share in my estate, the whole of the lands purchased by me from William Clarkson, William Crafts, Edward Crofts, & Robert English at the actual cost & charges.

That my Son inlaw if he chooses it, may have, as apart of his share in my Estate the whole of the lands purchased by me of Thomas Jones, & of the Sheriff of Sumpter district as the property of Rees, at the actual cost & charges.

That my son inlaw secure to my sons, the full value of whatsoever he may have received of me, & of whatsoever he may by this will, be entitled to receive out of my estate; the said full value to be payable, at his death, To my daughter, if she should survive him; or in case of her death, to any issue of hers, who may survive him; & if neither my daughter, nor any issue of hers should survive him, then only two thirds of said full value, to be payable to my sons, their Heirs & assigns forever, & to be payable only at the
