DAVID ANDERSON

In the Name of God Amen.-----I David Anderson of Camden District Craven County State of South Carolina, Planter being Sick & weak in body, but of perfect mind and Memory thanks be given unto God, therefore Calling unto Mind the Mortality of my Body, & knowing it that is appointed unto all Men once to die, do therefore Make & ordain this My last Will & Testament---first & primarily I give & becommend my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God who gave it in sure & certain hopes of receiving it again at the last day, & for such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this Life, I give & bequeath them in manner & form following That is to say-----

Item. I give & bequeath to my beloved Sons John Anderson & William Anderson all those Plantations ^{or} Tracts of Land makeing in the whole Twelve Hundred Acres, some of which were Granted to, others purchas'd by me, lying & being in the State of Georgia in a place call'd Newport, said Lands to be Equally divided between my said two Sons-----

Item I give & bequeath to my Son, Copper Anderson & to my Grandson in James Cantey another parcel of Land of two Tracts containing the whole four Hundred And fifty Acres, Situate in Newport in the State of Georgia to be equally divided between them-----

Item I give & bequeath to My beloved Son John Anderson a Negro fellow Named Tym & his Wife & ~~four~~ their four Youngest Children----

Item I give & bequeath to ~~James Cantey~~ My beloved Wife Mary Anderson all the estate wherewith she was possest at the time of our marriage with all increase & improvement thereon to be dispos'd of as She thinks proper-----

ordain this My last Will & Testament---first & primarily I give & recommend my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God who gave it in sure & certain hopes of receiving it again at the Last day, & for such worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life, I give & bequeath them in manner & form following That is to say-----

Item. I give & bequeath to my beloved Sons John Anderson & William Anderson all those Plantations ^{or} Tracts of Land makeing in the whole Twelve Hundred Acres, some of which were Granted to, others purchas'd by me, Lying & being in the State of Georgia in a place call'd Newport, said Lands to be Equally divided between my said two Sons-----

Item I give & bequeath to my Son, Copper Anderson & to my Grandson ⁱⁿ James Cantey another parcel of Land of two Tracts containing the whole four Hundred And fifty Acres, Situate in Newport in the State of Georgia to be equally divided between them-----

Item I give & bequeath to My beloved Son John Anderson a Negro fellow Named Tym & his Wife & ~~four~~ their four Youngest Children----

Item I give & bequeath to ~~James Cantey~~ My beloved Wife Mary Anderson all the estate wherewith she was possesst at the time of our marriage with all increase & improvement thereon to be dispos'd of as She thinks proper-----

Item I give & bequeath to Roger Wilson, Son of Davd Wilson deces'd a Tract of 50 Acres of Land on Blk river State of So Carolina, known by the Name of the Mill Tract-----

Item. I Will & desire that all the rest of my personal Estate be equally divided amongst ^{my} Beloved Wife, My Sons John, William, & Cooper, my Grandson James Cantey, my daughters, Mary, & Sarah.-----

Lastly I constitute Make & appoint My Son John, my wife Mary, Thomas Quarterman & Andrew Walltour Executors of this my last Will &

Codicil to Will Of David Anderson

Be it known unto all Men by these Presents That I David Anderson of
Medway in the State of Georgia, have made and declared that my last
Will and Testament in Writing bearing date the 12th of April one
Thousand seven hundred and Eighty four----I the said David Anderson
do ~~manly~~ by these Presents, confirm and Ratify my said last Will
and do give and Bequeath unto my Nephew John Anderson Four hundred
and Forty Three acres of Land of the Tract of Land whereon he now
lives; also I do give and Bequeath unto my Nephew William Anderson
Two hundred and fifty seven acres of Land on the supposed Barony
to them and their heirs forever ^{that} provided the abovesaid John Ander-
son Doth allow and permit his Mother Ann Anderson to live on any
part of the said Land During her Life Time, and it is also my ~~next~~ ^{Will}
and Desire that my Beloved Wife Mary do live upon and enjoy that
part of my land (lying and being in the State of Georgia) which is
bequeathed unto William Anderson During her Widowhood and I do also
give and Bequeath unto my Nephew Joseph Anderson my Tract of Land on
on/ Lynches Creek containing Two hundred acres to him and his heirs
forever and my Will and meaning is that this Codicil or Schedule be
esteemed and adjudged to be Part ~~with~~ parcel of my said Will and Tes-
tament, and that all Things therein contained and mentioned, be
faithfully preformed in as full and ample Manner in every Respect,
as if the same were so declared and set-down in my said Will,
In witness whereof I the said David Anderson have hereunto set my
hand and Seal, The 12th day of April 1784 Signed, Sealed, & pronoun-
ced and Declared in presence of
