I being in a low State of health, but of a perfect mind and Memory thanks be to God for his Mercy, but calling into mind the Martality of my body do Make & Ordain this instrument to be my last Will & Testament in manner and form as following To Wit principally & first of all I <sup>recommend</sup> give my soul into the hands of almighty God who gave it. My Body I recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian like manner - and astouching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to blefs me with I give & dispose of the <sup>in</sup> following Manner, <sup>1</sup> -(Viz. ) -----  
First I lend to beloved Wife Mary Woodham during her life One Negro Woman Named Cate, Also One Horse named Call, & my household furniture where she lives.-----  
Second, I lend to Mary Wiggins during her life One Negro Man Named Jacob. -----  
Thirdly I give to my Daughter Polly Alexander One Negro Man Named Jack to her and her heirs forever, -----  
Fourthly I give to my Grandson Ariss Woodham One Negro Man Named Fortune to him and his heirs forever, -----  
fifthly I give to my Daughter Levicy Caton all that tract of land I purchased of Daniel Wiggins Adjoining Doct. Millens land to her & her heirs forever.-----  
My will & desire is that my Stock of hogs & Cattle not heretofore given away to remain in the hands of my Wife & her benefit & after her death to be sold & divided among her Children. further my Will is that the Negro Girl Cate lent my Wife remain as my Estate until she has two Children Which Children are to be disposed of as follow the first if any I give to my Grandson Athanatius Woodson to him
