my last will and testament in manner and form following-----

To my beloved wife Elizabeth Catharine, and her heirs forever, I give and bequeath one negro wench named Juliet, with all her future issue, one negro boy named Sam, one good chair, one good Chair horse, one good bays horse, and five hundred dollars, to be paid her out of the crop that may be on hand at the time of my death, also Two hundred dollars to be paid her when she wishes to go to house keeping, to buy furniture, also James Hastings bond to Samuel Fley deceased for about on Tousand dollars ballance, also one third of a bond due by Ann Richardson to Samuel Fley dec^d for about on Thousand dollars, and all the furniture of her bed room, and it my will that my beloved wife do have her living in my house until she can make it convenient to go to house keeping, It is my will that the above legasis be considered in lew of all dower, as I have given her by deed of gift he brother Samuel Fley *personal* - *It is my will that the remaining two thirds of the bond due by Ann Richardson to Samuel Fley* deceased, be equally divided between Marial Fley, and the children of Ann, Sister of Marial Fley, agreeable to the last request of Samuel Fley dec^d.

To my grand daughter Francis, Mary, and her heirs forever, I give and bequeath one negro firt named Pogey, with all her future issue--To my grand daughter Margaret, and her heirs forever, I give and bequeath one negro girl named Liddy, with all her future issue--To my grand son Peter Horry, and his heirs forever. I give and bequeath my silver mounted gun, and forty dollars to buy him a watch--It is my will that my grave yard is inclosed by a substantial stone wall four feet high, and marble head and foot stones, to my late beloved wife, my good friend Samuel Fley, and Self---- To my son John and his heirs forever, I give and bequeath all that tract of land known by the name of the machine Fort containing as pur plot four hundred and ninety five acres

also the slip of land, adjoining said tract, beginning at a small
 safsifras corner, in the lane between James Hartley and self, and
 from theres runing in a dyrect line to the corner of the oats
 field commonly calld Snipe field (as pur Hasting Ginnings plat
 of said land).-- To Provide more-effectually for my son Benjamin
 G. and his posterity after him, as I am apprehensive he will
 injur himself by his unbounded generosity, I give and bequeath
 him during life, and to his legitimate issue after him, all that
 all that tract of land whereon I reside with the dwelling house
 out buildings & Ct containing as pur plot about Six hundred and
 fifty acres, in cluding the slip of land given as above to my son
 John, but to be liable for no debt he shall contract, and in case
 of his death without legetimate issue, I give and bequeath to my
 son John and his heirs forever all the above mentioend tract of
 land, with the dwelling house out building ect- I give and be-
 queath to my son Benjamin. G. and his heirs forever, two negro
 men named Sharpen, and Nat, and one negro boy named Peter, one
 negro wench namd Pender, with her infant child namd Abram, with
 her future issue, and negro child namd Resetha, with all her fut-
 ure issue---To my son John and his heirs forever, I give and be-
 queath one motto wench named Thieby, with all her future ifse,
 and one negro boy named James-The remainder of my Estate both
 real and personal, of what kind so ever, after the above bequests,
 I give and bequeath to to my son John and his heirs forever, the
 one-half-. The other half I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin.
 G. during life, and to his legetimate issue after him mforever,
 but to be liable for no debts he may contract, and in case of his
 death without legetimate issue, I give and bequeath the remaining

field commonly called Snipe field (as per plat of said land).-- To Provide more-effectually for my son Benjamin G. and his posterity after him, as I am apprehensive he will injur himself by his unbounded generosity, I give and bequeath him during life, and to his legitimate issue after him, all that all that tract of land whereon I reside with the dwelling house out buildings &c containing as per plot about Six hundred and fifty acres, including the slip of land given as above to my son John, but to be liable for no debt he shall contract, and in case of his death without legitimate issue, I give and bequeath to my son John and his heirs forever all the above mentioned tract of land, with the dwelling house out building etc- I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin. G. and his heirs forever, two negro men named Sharper, and Nat, and one negro boy named Peter, one negro Wench named Pender, with her infant child named Abram, with her future issue, and negro child named Resetha, with all her future issue---To my son John and his heirs forever, I give and bequeath one motto wench named Thisby, with all her future issue, and one negro boy named James-The remainder of my Estate both real and personal, of what kind so ever, after the above bequests, I give and bequeath to to my son John and his heirs forever, the one-half-. The other half I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin. G. during life, and to his legitimate issue after him forever, but to be liable for no debts he may contract, and in case of his death without legitimate issue, I give and bequeath the remaining half of my Estate to my son John and his heirs forever/say the half given as above to my son Benjamin . G.-----
Finally I Constitue my two sons John, and Benjamin, G. Executors to this my last will and testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Seventh day of May one Thousand eight hundred and nine
