In the name of God amen, I JohnMcCoy Senior of the State of South Carolina and District of Sumter being weak and afflicted in body but ~~possessing~~ a Sound and disposing mind do make this my last will and testament (hereby revoking all others made by me here to fore) in manner and form following; to wit. First I recommend my soul to Almighty God who gave it, hoping that I shall receive the remission of my Sins and be received into his kingdom of rest; my body I wish to be decently buried at the discretion of my friends and with regard to the worldly goods with which it hath pleased God to blefs me I give and dispose of in the following Manner, Item. I give devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife Catharine my two negro men, by names Bob and Anthony to be disposed of by her at her discretion-Item I give devise and bequeath unto my Beloved wife Catharine, also all my household and kitchen furniture and my Stock of horses, cattle and hogs, being all that I am now possessed of. It is also my will and desire <sup>all of</sup> that my children do hold the property that I have here to fore given them and of which they are now possessed; and I do hereby constitute <sup>Catharine</sup> and appoint my beloved wife, Executrix and my son William Executor to this my last will and Testament, sealed and signed with my hand this first day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighteen and in the forty third year of the Independence of the United States of America
