2. I give to my beloved Daughter Frances Pollard one feather bed & furniture-----

3. I give to my beloved Daughter Elizabeth Pollard one feather Bed & furniture-----

4. My wish is for the remainder part of my personal Estate to be sold to the best advantage & laid out in young Negro wenches to be equally divided divided between my two Daughters Frances & Elizabeth Pollard-----

5. My wish is all my lawfull debts to be paid out of my personal Estate-----

I do hereby constitute and appoint Captain Rueben Long and Fyn Jennings to act as my Executors to my Estate -----

Signed Sealed by John Pollard as his last Will & Testament this 5th day of July in the year of our Lord 1803-----
