KENNETH M^CCALLUM

In the name of God Amen the fourth day of September ^{one} thousand and eight hundred and two I Kenneth M^CCallum of Salem County and State of South Carolina planter being weak in body but of perfect mind and Memory thanks be given unto God therefore calling unto mind the mortality of my Body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hand of God that gave it and my to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named nothing doubting but I shall receive the Same at the general Resurrection by the mighty power of God and as to worldly Estate I dispose of the Same in the following manner and form. Imprimus I give to Elizabeth my ^{her} Wife for dowry and that during the time she remains my Widow the Plantation and House thereon whereon I now live containing two hundred Acres of land originally granted to David Williams as also I lend my said Wife one Mare Bridle and her side Saddle and one half of all my removeable property and lastly I give to my said Wife one half of the yearly income of my Ferry to be paid by my Executors to my said Wife every Year and that punctually during her life for her maintenance. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Malcom M^CCallum all and singularly the remaining part of all my real and moveable Estate not already mentioned and given to my said Wife in manner above specified, and after my said Wife is Deceased I give and bequeath to my said Son Malcom M^CCallum the above mentioned ^{two} hundred Acres of land whereon I now live, I do hereby constitute nominate and appoint Captain Joseph Way and my said Son Malcom M^CCallum Executors of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby

appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my Soul into the hand of God that gave it and my to the Earth to be buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named nothing doubting but I shall receive the Same at the general Resurrection by the mighty power of God and as to worldly Estate I dispose of the Same in the following manner and form. Imprimus I give to Elizabeth my ^{her} Wife for a dowry and that during the time she remains my Widow the Plantation and House thereon whereon I now live containing two hundred Acres of land originally granted to David Williams as also I lend my said Wife one Mare Bridle and her side Saddle and one half of all my removeable property and lastly I give to my said Wife one half of the yearly ~~income~~ ^{income} of the Ferry to be paid by my Executors to my said Wife every Year and that punctually during her life for her maintenance. Item I give and bequeath to my Son Malcom M^cCallum all and Singularly the remaining part of all my real and moveable Estate not already mentioned and given to my said Wife in manner above specified, and after my said Wife is Deceased I give and bequeath to my said Son Malcom M^cCallum the above mentioned ^{two} hundred Acres of land whereon I now live, I do hereby constitute nominate and appoint Captain Joseph Way and my said Son Malcom M^cCallum Executors of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby disannul all and every other former Testament, Will, legacies and bequests and Executors by me in any wise before named Willed and be^uqueathed ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I ^{have} hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and Year above written.
