Dear Sir,

Be it known unto You and all others whom it may concern, That I Philip Perry formerly a residenter on Your plantationis, Neaf Charleston South Carolina, being extreemly indispos'd & awfully appuhensive That I Nev^r shall recover from my present, illnefs, and being in a perfect-state of Mind, do deem it prudent & highly Necessary to leave & Make a particular & correct arrangement of my affairs, which I leave in, ^{the hands} & trust to the Management of My friend Mr John Dargan I do hereby certify that You are indebted to ~~Me~~ ^{the} Sum of Three hundred & fifty Dollars, for the last-Years services, render'd to You in the capacity of an overseir which sum You will please to pay to the above Nam'd John Dargan or order, Also You will pay him all other Monies ^{Me} which May be due on a settlement--A true act, of which I trust to Your honor to render & pay for the benefit of My poor orphan children--I do further certify, ~~that~~, That I have chosen & appointed by the presents do chuse & appoint, the above Mentioned John Dargan My legal Executor to My Estate both personal, & perishable, to be invested with full authority to act as My power of attorney, to act-in all cases for Me, to receive all Monies for Me, to pay My debts, provided, there is a sufficiency remaining to give, & take receipts in all cases as if I were present Myself-- This My last request respecting My worldly concerns--Given from under My hand this Seventh day of January 1813-----
