

In the name of God, Amen, I Sackfield Bracey of the State of South Carolina and Sumter District, Being very sick and weak in body, but of Perfect mind and memory, Thanks be given unto God, calling unto mind the mortality of my Body, and knowing that is appointed for all manence to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say principally and first of all, I gave and recomend my Soul into the hand of Almighty God that gave it, and my body I recommend to the earth, to be buried in a decent christain buriel at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubt^{ing} but at the general resurrection, I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power of God, and as to touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased god to blefs me in this life, I gave, demise, and dispose of the same in the following manner and form,--

First, I gave and bequeath to Lucy my Dearly beloved wife, and equal and full part of all my real and Personal Estate, with my eleven children, Say one Twelfth part of all my Estate, All my House Hold furniture I freely gave to her except one fether bed to each of my children when they become of age- I also do impower my Son Randolph Bracey and Geo Henry Nixon, to be my executors ---

Also I gave to my well beloved Son, Randolph a negro boy Named Ransom and the sune of Two hundred Dollas in Cash and an equal part after, all his Sisters and Brothers Get a proposinal shear or equivilant to the said negro boy Ransom and Two hundred Dollars of what property then remains after the younger child becomes of age, and gets an equivelant----- Also I gave to my well beloved Daughter Ann Roach, a negro girl named Rish and Two hundred Dollars in cash, and Seventy five Dollars for, the price of a horse, which I sold belonging to her, and was gave hir by hir Uncle William Bracey- and a equal part after all hir Brothers and Sisters git an equivelant part with the above named negro girl and Two hundred Dolas----- Also I gave to my well beloved Daughter Rebecca Nixon a negro boy named Antony and have, allready delivered hir Two hundred Dollars and She is to Draw hir equil part after^{all} hir

brother and Sisters get and equivilant to the said boy antony and

Two hundred dollars-----

Also I gave to my well beloved Daughter Dorotha Bracey- a negro
Girl named Elen and Two hundred Dollars, when She becomes of age
and and hir equil part^{after} with all hir Brothers and Sisters get and
equivelant to Said girl Elen and Two hindred Dollars-----

Also I gave to my well beloved Daughter Martha Bracey a negro
boy named Dones and Two hundred Dollars, when she becomes of age
and hir equil part after all hir Brothers and Sisters get an
equivelant to said Boy Dones and Two hundred Dollars-----

Also my young children Named Maclin, Harrison, Meria Washington
Emely and Sarah, each and all of them as they Become of age an
equivelant to said named negros above mentioned and each of them
Two hundred Dolas, and when Sarah my youngest child becomes of
Age, Then all the Ballance remaining to be equilly Devided between
my eleven named Children-----
