The real part, to be to her, during her natural life, and after death, to return to the estate of the above said Samuel Bradleys legal heirs. Item. The other half of my Estate real and personal I leave and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Elisabeth Wasbery, Bradley to her and her heirs forever. Item--it is my Will and desire that the whole of my property do remain together undivided untill my wife or my daughter Marry, or my Daughter come to the age of Twenty one in either case, then the Estate to be divided as above mentioned--Lastly, I do hereby Constitute and ordain my beloved Brothers William Bradley & James Bradley with my trusty Friend William Wilson to be my lawful Executors to this my last Will, and hereby do disanul all other Will or Wills made by me, confirming this, and this only---In Witnefs hereof I have set my hand and Seal this 31st day of October in the year of God One Thousand eight hundred and fourteen, & in the Thirty Eight year of our Independence-----
