I William Montgomery of S., Marks parish In the province of South Carolina being weak In Body but of good & perfect Memory thanks be given Unto God Therefore willing to Mind The Mortality of My body & Expecting the time of My dissolution to be Near at hand I do Make And Ordain this My last will & testament And first of All I give & Recommend My Soul to the Hands of God who gave it and for My body I Recommend it to the Earth to be Buried in A Christian like & decent Manner At the discretion of my Executors Nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection & Shall Receive the same again by the Mighty power of God and As to tuching Such worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to blefs me in this life I give bequeath & Dispose of the Same in the following Manner And form Imprimis it is My will that My funeral Charges & lawfull debts Shall be first paid Out of My Estate, Item I give & bequeath to My Dear beloved wife Martha Montgomery the Liberty of Living on My lands during her widow Hood & one third of My Personal Estate Item I give And bequeath to My Dear beloved Son James Henry Montgomery All the rest of My Estate Both Real & personal Except My wife shold Be pregnant at My death then that Child if A son to divide both Real & personal Estate Equally with My Son James Henry Montgomery, And if Adaughter to divide the Personal Estate Equally with My Son James Henry Montgomery Item it is my will that Amalotta guirl by the Name of Susea Allen Shall have her freedom when She Arrives to The Age of Thirty years Item Ayallow guirl by the Name Sarah Shall have her freedom when she comes to the Age of Twinty Years Item I Make Constitute and
