gro girl between 12 & 15 years of age, an \$300, to be paid her by
my executors, in one year after my Death or Sooner if Convenient.

I likewise leave my Daughter N P Rees, \$5000 to be paid her in
Money in one year after marriage or when she arrives at the age of
twenty one years, it my wish the negro should he work on the
plantations above mention and all moneys, arising from the crops,
that is not expended Raising and Education Should be put to
Interest and an Equal Devision maid between them the devision takes
place.-----
