 from the other part of the plantation to Liv and Raise the
 Children on Dureing her Life or widow hood then the hole Estate
 that Remains after the Children is Raised or Comes of age to Be
 equally Devided among my five Children Namly John paty James
 paty Lorobabel paty Mayy paty Joshua paty item I give and Bequeath
 to my Son Charles paty five Shilling item I give and Bequeth to my
 Son Jesse paty five Shilling item I give and Bequeath to my
 Daughter Deliah mullins one Cow and Calf item I give and Bequeath
 to my two youngest Sons Namly Lorobabel paty and Joshua paty all
 my Lands and plantation to them and there heirs for Ever to Be
 Equally Devided Betwam them when they Both Come of age and if
 either of them Should dy without have the othe to have it and
 also the two thirds of the profits arising on the plantation
 untel they Come of age and I also Do Constitute and appoint my
 Loving wife Deliah paty and my Loving Son John paty and my trusty
 friend Turner Kendrick to Be my Executors to this my Last
 will and testament
