him through the Merits of Jesus Christ - My Lord and Savior;
And My Body to the Dust from Whence it Was Taken to Be Decently
Buried at the Expence of my Executors And as for My Wordly Goods
I will that they Be Disposed of in the folowing manner - and
first of all I will that All My Lawful Debts Be paid,
and 2^d ly I Will and Bequeath that Fanney My trusty and Well Be-
loved Wife Doe posses and Enjoy as her Naturel Right all My Es-
tate Real and personal During her Life or Widowhood; and in Case
My Wire Maries or Dieth Before My Children Cometh of Age, then
My Will, is, that, my Executors shall keep My Estate together
and Make the Best they Can of it for the Raising and Educating
of My Childrin till they All Com of Age and than (and Not till
than) to Be Equally Divided amongst My Children Male and femal
in any Manner that the Major part of them shall Agree upon, and
Lastly I Do Will constitute and apoint, that My Well Beloved
Wife and my trusty and Well Beloved friends David Smith my son
inlaw and Nicholas Corry Be my Executors of this my Last Will
and testament, signed seald Constituted and acknowledged By me
this 12th day of Nov. in the year of our Lord 1792
