Testament in the following manner , first I desire that my body
be buried in a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my
beloved wife my funeral charges and Just debts may be paid and
discharged with all convenient speed after my decease . Secondly
I give and Bequeath or demise unto my beloved wife Mary Weldon all
my Estate after my funeral charger and Just Debts are paid either
lands , Goods Chattles or Credits or whatso ever I may be pos-
sessed of at the time of my decease to have and to hold to
her her heirs and assigns forever , whom I likewise Constitute,
make and Ordain the sole Executors of this my last will and
Testament , disanulling and Revoking all Other wills and confirm-
ing this to . my last will and Testament witness my hand and
seal this 29th of the third Month call'd March . Anodomin 1798.
