And as Touching my Worldly Estate that "hath pleased God to
Bless me With on this Life I give and Dispose of in the fol-
lowing Manner. FIRST I give and allow unto my beloved wife
Mary my whole Estate both Real and personal during her Widow-
hood. And then I give and Bequeath unto my three Sons my Lands
to be Equally Divided according to Quantity & Quallity Allowing
my Son John Foster Hendly the lower part also my Son George
Hendly the upper part and unto my Son William Herrod Hendly
the part that I now live On - Also I give unto my three Sons
above Mentioned my two Negroe Girls. Loose and Lusey to be
Equally Divided both them and their Ofspring to them and their
Heirs and lastly I give and Bequeath the Remainder and Rever-
sion of my Estate after my Just Debts are paid unto my three
Sons to be Equally Divided. Also I Ordain and appoint my Be-
loved wife Mary Jointly with my Trusty Friends Edward Tilman
and William M'Cullock to be my Exeutors. als I disanul
