

And no Longer; then to go to my Son Thomas Lee, & his  
Heirs forever. - - - - -

Secondarily, I give, & Bequeath unto my Son John Lee, Sixty Acres of Land, being a part of the Above Tract of Two hundred & forty Acres; Beginning next to, & Adjoining my Son Michael, above him, & Running up the River, far enough, to include said Sixty Acres; to have & to Hold, during his Natural Life time; & then to be Equally Divided among the other Sons.

Settle & live on the above tract; otherwise it is to fall back & be equally Divided among the other Boys, as above said.

Thirdly, I Give & Bequeath unto my Son Joseph Sixty Acres of Land; being a Part of the above Tract of Two Hundred & Forty Acres, Begining on the River Adjoining to my son John, above him, & Extending up the River far enough to Include Sixty Acres; (provided he, Joseph doth build on, Settle, Clear, & Cultivate, a<sup>d</sup> Land,) to have & to Hold for ever; & his Heirs & Assigns;

Fourthly, I Give & Bequeath unto my Son Thomas Lee, his Heirs & Assigns for ever; the Remainder of the above Tract of Two Hundred & forty Acres, (still above, my Son Joseph Lee;) - being Sixty Acres of Land, with the Houses, or Buildings, & other Improvements of whatever kind, that he, s<sup>d</sup> Thomas Lee, hath done or caused to be done, on the aforesaid Tract of Sixty Acres

And also I Give, & Bequeath unto my above Named Sons, Thomas, Joseph & John, & to their Lawful Heirs for ever; Two Hundred & forty-five Acres of Land, it being the Remainder of a Tract of Two hundred & Fifty Acres; Granted to me, (the Low Land consisting of Five Acres, More, or Less, being Bequeathed as above) to be Equally Divided among them, by my Executors herein after named; as followeth, Viz. - That my Son Thomas shall have his Share & Proportion of the s<sup>d</sup> Land, to Include the Dwelling & Improvement he now has Made, extending Upward & Outward, so as to Include his equal Proportion of s<sup>d</sup> Land - And that the Remainder Shall be equally Divided Between my other Two Sons, Joseph & John Lee, to be their Right for ever; provided they do Improve & Cultivate the same, ---- Nevertheless if my s<sup>d</sup> Sons should all be Disposed to sell the above Described & Bequeathed Lands, they shall be at Liberty, with the Approval of my Executors to Dispose of the same; Notwithstanding anything herein contained to the Contrary. - Union County Wills, 1777 to 1800

Provided they Purchase other Land with the Consideration Money which they Receive for the Land above mentioned; which Land Purchased shall be under the same Regulation & Restriction as the Land above Bequeathed - - - - - - - - - - - - - - - -

ITEM, I give & Bequeath unto my Sons Michael Lee, & William Lee, & to my Daughters Catharine Brood, Jean Revel, Oliviah Fraser, Sarah Bates, & Nancy Jackson, One Guinea to each, and every of them, to be Paid to them, by my Executors Twelve Months after my Decease, if Demanded -

ITEM, it is my Will that all my Debts be Collected, & a Reasonable Charge Paid out of the same, to the Collector, for his Trouble & the Remainder to be equally Divided amongst my Three Sons, Thomas, Joseph & John Lee; That is, I commit to the Care, & it is my desire my Executors, would Advertise my Cattle, Swine, Sheep, with my Household Furniture, & Casks or Vessels of every kind, & propose them at Publick Auction within Twelve Months after my Decease at the Law Requires; & after all, debts are Collected, & the Collector Reasonably paid for his Trouble, the Rest to be Divided as above.

And Lastly, I do hereby Nominate, Constitute & Appoint my trusty Friends, Drury Murrel, George Harlin, Hatter, & my beloved Son Thomas Lee, to be my Sole Executors, to this my last Will and Testament; Hereby Revoking & making void all other former Wills, & Testaments, by me, heretofore, Made, & Declaring this Sheet of Paper written on both Sides & no other, to be my last Will & Testament: IN witness whereof, I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal, this Twelf Day of September in the Year of our Lord One Thousand, seven hundred & Ninety six -
