I Alexander Glass of Williamsburgh District in the State afore
said Planter, being of sound disposing mind memory and under-
standing but mindful of my mortality do this fifteenth day of
April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
Sixteen and in forteeth year of the Independence of the united
State, Make and publish this my last Will and Testament, in
manner and form following First I desired to be decently buried--
Item. I will and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Five Negro
slaves named Buster, Sinkey, Judy Mark and Jack during her
natural life at the expiration of which I will and bequeath the
said five named Negro Slaves to such child or children as she
may have then living--Item--I will and bequeath unto my said
wife Elizabeth my Chair and one horse, such one as she may
think proper to select, also half of my House hold and Kitchen
furniture; also half of my stock of cattle and hogs to her her
executors administrators and assigns Item I will and bequeath
unto my said Wife Elizabeth the use of my House together with
as much land as she can with her Negro Slaves cultivate During
her widowhood and no longer Item I will and bequeath the resi-
due of my property after paying my Just and lawful debts, to
be equally divided between my children, and in case any one
should die before he or she becomes of age then I will and
direct that his or her share to be equally divided between the
survivors, and in case all die before they become of age then
I will and bequeath the property which I have bequeathed to
them, to the children of my sister Abigail Wilson who is now
dead, and who was the wife of Robert Wilson--said children are
named Thomas Wilson, Abigail Wilson and Margaret Wilson I
request my Friends Thomas Witherapoon and Col. William Salters
to be the executors of this my last will and testament, and I
Hereby appoint and nominate them for that purpose----
