If either of the other three girls die under age I wish her part to be equally divided between the other Two I do autherise my Executors to take charge of the fourth part which is coming to Agnes Scott Jane Scott and Elizabeth Ann Scott until they are of age and to furnish other suplies for their education and clothing at their own discretion, and if Mary Ann M^cCullough dies under age I wish her part to be equally divided between her uncles William and Alexander M^cCulloughs my waring apparels I
