marries from that she shall only be entitled to one third
of the land during life and at her death it is to return
back to the children I also leave her the negro boy Peter.
2nd I bequeath unto my son John one half of my land to be
given to him when he comes to the age of twenty one years.
3rd I bequeath unto my Daughters Hannah Fleming and Martha
Wary the other half of my land to be given up to them when
they come of age.

4th I give and bequeath unto my son John and Daughters Hannah
Fleming and Martha Mary the Negroes Doll and Derry & their fute
ure ifsue to be equally divided amongst them when ever they
come of age and if either of them dies under age or without
Ifsue the property is to return to the living heirs.

after my lawful debts are paid to remain on the plantation for the support of my wife and family untill she marries or my son John arrives to the age of twenty one years then for it to be equally divided amongst them. Lastly I nominate and
