State aforesaid being in, - and possessing my common thoughts & Understanding Do make, constitute and ordain this my last will

& testament in the manner following (that is to say) I give grant devise & bequeath unto my daughter Mary Ann MCCrea Gordon, my whole & sole Estate of every description to her & her lawfal ISsue that arrives to twenty one years of age -- My will is further that no part said Estate shall ever be subject to the debts, contracts, nor in any way at the disposal of any husband or husbands which my/daughters may ever have. Should my daughters die without lawful Issue that arrives to the specified age, my will is that the property shall go to the lawful Issue of Thomas A. MCCrea, with the exception of One thousand dollars which I will to Mary Ann MCCullough and should there be no such Issue as is here in specified. My will is that My Daughter may give it to whom she pleases whether she be married or single but if she should fail to do so, then my will is that the property (particularly the negroes) be set at liberty --- as to the balance I care not what is done with it -- and for the further proper execution of this my last will and testament I nominate & appoint James Mcfadden, Thos. A. McCrea, William Cooper George Barr. Hugh MCCutchen & my daughter executors to this my last will & testament, and I do uterly revoke all other wills by me made testimony of this my last will.
