Second. I will devise and bequeath to my well beloved Wife Mary McClary for and during her natural life, the whole of the planta tion and land on which we now reside containing in the whole one

Dollard a negroe boy salve named Sam to her and her lawful issue forever---- I will and bequeath to my son William D. McClary, a negro Girl named Substant and Committee of the same Sitira (after the death of his Mother) together with their future increase to him the said Wm D. McClary and his lawful issue
