In the name of God Amen The State of South Carolina I Elizabeth Graham of the District of Williamsburgh in the State aforesaid Relict being aged but of a sound and disposing mind and memory do make this my last Will and Testament I give and bequeath unto my son John Graham ten Dollars to be paid him by my Executor herein after mentioned I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Ferrell a negro woman slave Nancy with her future Issue and increase unto my said Daughter Mary Ferrell during her natural life and at her death to my said daughters children to wit Mary S. Ferrell Robert G. Ferrell Cothena L Blakely Benjamin T. Ferrell and William Ferrell to be Equally divided share and share alike among them I also give and bequeath unto my said Daughter Mary Ferrell all other claims Which I may have of Either Real or personal Estate which are not above mentioned during her natural life and at her death to be Equally divided among my said Daughters children Who are above mentioned Nevertheless I leave It in the power of my Executor should he feel so disposed and thinks it beneficial to my said Daughter Mary Ferrell and her children as above mentioned to sell and dispose of the said negro woman slave nanny & her Issue & to purchase other negro slaves from the Money or friends arising from such sale and the negro slaves so purchased by my Executor shall be the property of my said Daughter Mary Ferrell during her natural life and at her death to be Equally divided among my said Daughters children as above mentioned share and share alike among them I also which my Executor to sell or dispose of any Claim which he may think I have which are not herein particularly

do make this my last Will and Testament I give and bequeath unto my son John Graham ten Dollars to be paid him by my Executor herein after mentioned I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Ferrell a negro woman slave Nancy with her future Issue and increase unto my said Daughter Mary Ferrell during her natural life and at her death to my said daughters children to wit Mary S. Ferrell Robert G. Ferrell Cothena L Blakely Benjamin T. Ferrell and William Ferrell to be Equally divided share and share alike among them I also give and bequeath unto my said Daughter Mary Ferrell all other claims Which I may have of Either Real or personal Estate which are not above mentioned during her natural life and at her death to be Equally divided among my said Daughters children Who are above mentioned Nevertheless I leave It in the power of my Executor should he feel so disposed and thinks it beneficial to my said Daughter Mary Ferrell and her children as above mentioned to sell and dispose of the said negro woman slave nanny & her Issue & to purchase other negro slaves from the Money or friends arising from such sale and the negro slaves so purchased by my Executor shall be the property of my said Daughter Mary Ferrell during her natural life and at her death to be Equally divided among my said Daughters children as above mentioned share and share alike among them I also which my Executor to sell or dispose of any Claim which he may think I have which are not herein particularly mentioned & to purchase other property such as she may think proper or more beneficial to my said Daughter Mary Ferrell and her Children and such property shall be the property of my said Daughter during her natural life and at her death to be Equally divided among her Children Within mentioned And I do hereby Constitute and appoint Robert G Ferrell my Executor of this my last Will and Testament In Testimony whereof
