ELIZABETH MCKEE.

State of South Carolina

In the name of God amen--the second day--of July-----in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and ten, I Elizabeth McKee, of Williamsburg district, and state aforesaid; being weak in body but of perfect mind memory and understanding; yet calling to mind the mortality of my body, and knowing that is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament.- Principally and first of all I recommend my soul to God who gave it; my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent christian manner at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but I shall receive the same again at the general resurrection; and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I demise and bequeath in the manner following--Imprimis I order all my just debts and funeral charges to be paid out of my estate--
Item--I will and bequeath to my nephew David Shaw, my three negroes, Phillis, Jane, & Sam, he to pay back to my executors or administrators, in money, the value of Sam--which I deem his full share of my estate-----

Item--To my niece ~~of~~ Elizabeth Shaw, I will and bequeath my horse, riding chair & harness, my bed, bedstead and furniture--
Item To my two nephews John Shaw & William Shaw and to my three nieces Elizabeth Shaw, Lillie Shaw, and Sarah Alvira Shaw, I will and bequeath the whole of the remainder of my estate---- should one or more of my nephews or nieces, named in this clause of my will to whom I have bequeathed the remainder of my estate, die without leaving issue, or before marriage his/her

and knowing that ~~is appointed~~ for all men once to die, do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament.~ Principally~ and first of all I recommend my soul to God who gave it; my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent christ-ian manner at the discretion of my executors, nothing doubting but I shall receive the same again at the general resurrection; and as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in this life, I demise and bequeath in the manner following--Imprimis I order all my just debts and funeral charges to be paid out of my estate--

Item To my two nephews John Shaw & William Shaw and to my three nieces Elisabeth Shaw, Lillie Shaw, and Sarah Elvira Shaw, I will and bequeath the whole of the remainder of my estate---- should one or more of my nephews or nieces, named in this clause of my will to whom I have bequeathed the remainder of my estate, die under lawful age, or before marriage his, her, or their part, or parts to revert to, and be equally divided amongst the surviving brother or brothers, and sister or sisters of the full blood

Item--I nominate and appoint my two nephews David Shaw & John Shaw, executors of this my last will and testament, hereby revoking and making void all former wills legacies and bequeath confirming this, and this only, to be my last will and testa-ment.
