Education & in case of the death of either Francis malsh son of Thes --- or Jane Commick Daughter of Patrick I wish that the d. ce fifteen Hundred Dollars be divided equally among the surviving children of se Thos & in like manner among the se children of se Patrick Commick. 4th I leave & bequeath to my son which I had by a young woman in Ireland known by the name of Biddy & the se child I expect is at my brother Toms-Ave hundred Dollars- to give him schooling & in case of his Death. it shall refer to my Brother Tom children share & share alike- The rest residue & remainder of all I die posseses off. bleave to my brother Thomas Waleh & Patrick Commick son of Rich. Commick. Share & Share alike I wish no suit at Law but a fair construction on this my last will & Testament; in witness whereof I have put my hand & seal this 24th day of July 1817---- & the forty fifth year of the Independence of america--Witness Present
