Barr one horse and chair she to take her choice of the horses the rest of the horses sulkey tools and such like articles that would be of any use to the plantation I wish to be sold and the money with what the money may besides the five handred dollars above mentioned I wish to be divided into four parts my wife to receave one part the other their parts to be kept on interest to assist in schooling my three children (viz) Agnas Hannah. Sarah Elizabeth, George Daniel if there cant be enough made on the plantation to school them 3rd I will that the ballance of my prop erty both real and personal I do will to be kept together until my two children Sarah Elizabeth and George Daniel comes of age or marys and then to be equally divided between the said two children to wit, Sarah Elizabeth and George Daniel share and share alike It is further my will that in case that any or either of the above named three children should die leaving no lawfull issue the deceased childs part to be equally divided between the surviving children and it is my will that if the widow should marry and continue on the plantation the property can still remain as before but if the Executors should see that

Sarah Elizabeth and George Daniel share and share alike It is further my will that in case that any or either of the above named three children should die leaving no lawfull issue the deceased childs part to be equally divided between the surviving children and it is my will that if the widow should marry and continue on the plantation the property can still remain as before but if the Executors should see that the property was not managed as it should be it is my will that they should manage it to the best advantage for my children and I do leave it-in the power of my Executors to chose fresholdins to appraise my Estate and make sales without the order of any Court whatever and I do also leave them in fool power to pay all my lawfull debts and to collect all debts owing to me Lastly I Nominate and appoint James Gibson JoSiah Cockfield and James H.
